Shawsheen River Restoration: CER is leading a public/private partnership to remove two dams from the Shawsheen River in Andover, MA, in order to restore native migratory fish and other ecological values to the Shawsheen and Merrimack Rivers.

Roger Williams Park Alliance Development: CER is working with the City of Providence to develop a new non-profit “friends” group or conservancy to help restore and improve Roger Williams Park.

Pawtuxet River Restoration: CER is leading a partnership to explore ecological restoration and flood control measures on the Pawtuxet River, R.I.

Sachuest Point Resiliency Restoration: CER is working with the Town of Middletown, R.I., to complete a major coastal restoration project at Sachuest Point, R.I., including beach dune restoration and stormwater management.

Saltmarsh Resiliency Restoration: CER is working with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service to develop and complete a major salt marsh and estuarine restoration project on the Narrow River Estuary, part of the John H. Chafee National Wildlife Refuge in Narragansett and South Kingstown, R.I.
